Duration of the Condition

The duration of a common cold actually varies but it usually can last for not more than 10 days. On the other hand, a sinus infection lasts for approximately 1014 days or more. Specifically, the symptoms of a serious sinusitis last for less than A month while those of a **chronic sinusitis** last for more than 8 weeks. Just in case the sinusitis flares up again for around 3 or maybe more acute episodes in a year, it is also classified as chronic.

Nasal Discharge

Another indication that there is a sinus infection is from the color of the nose release. Regarding sinusitis victims, the discharge is typically thick together with pus that is yellowish or goldtinged to yellow-green in color. This is a sign of infection. To the contrary, a common chilly is because of the effects of a viral infection. It is for this reason that the nasal discharge is clear or whitish in color.
